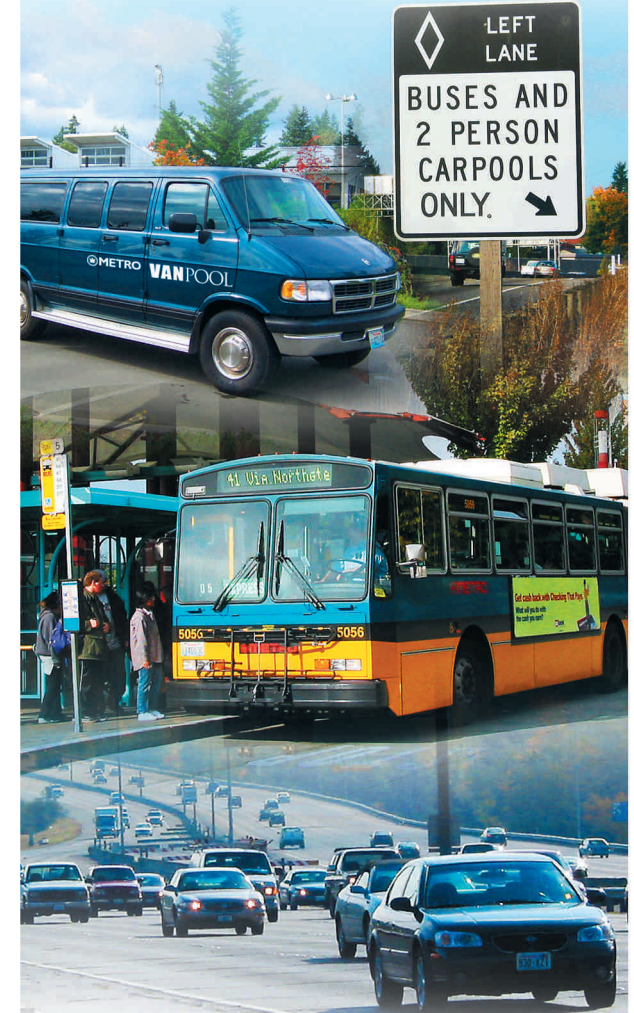

An Alliance for Transportation



The TMA is a non-profit group dedicated to improving transportation services in, to, and through the Duwamish business community, extending from the professional sports stadiums in the north to King County International Airport in the south.

The TMA can help business owners and managers address individual transportation needs while serving as a community advocate for government projects, issues, and policies impacting the Duwamish business community. Through a unique partnership with Metro, the TMA can also connect businesses with free and low-cost services that encourage employees to ride the bus, join carpools, and use other alternatives to drive alone commuting.

TMA members are welcome to participate in events where they can get to know key government decision makers and administrators for transportation services.

The TMA operates in partnership with the City of Seattle, the Washington State Department of Transportation, King County Metro, and the Port of Seattle.



The goal of Seattle First is to encourage Seattle industrial firms to remain in the city by assisting in fixing the problems that might cause them to leave. Through a unique partnership with the City of Seattle and other public agencies, Seattle First can connect businesses with government troubleshooters who are assigned to help solve problems.

It can also arrange for free consultations by private consultants with professional expertise in real estate, construction, and environmental issues. In addition, it can help businesses gain access to more than 60 free or low-cost services designed to aid Seattle industrial firms.

More than 30 industrial firms received assistance in the first six months that the program was in operation, and members of the Seattle First team are available right now to help you. For more information call the MIC at 206-762-2470.

Seattle First is cosponsored by the MIC and the City of Seattle with support from the Port of Seattle and Viking Bank. Other sponsors include Puget Sound Properties, Kane Environmental, MulvannyG2 Architecture, "ECOSS" and the Washington State Department of Labor and Industries.

Seattle First is a proactive effort to retain Seattle businesses and help dislocated or expanding businesses find new sites within the city limits.



MIC Responds to Community Needs

Transportation, redtape, government regulations. These are just a few of the issues the Manufacturing Industrial Council (MIC) tackles for industrial employers every day.

The Manufacturing Industrial Council was formed in 1998 by a handful of volunteers concerned about the future of Seattle's industrial business community. Today, the group includes about 60 members – some big, some small – all sharing a commitment to retain and support the family wage job base of the city.

The MIC and its partner group, the Duwamish Transportation Management Association, are proactively engaged with local, regional and state decision makers to get the best outcomes possible involving government policies and practices that impact industrial firms. Through an innovative partnership with the City of Seattle, the MIC also cosponsors the Seattle First service program to directly support individual businesses.

As part of its role as an advocate for businesses, the MIC publishes *Seattle Industry*, a quarterly magazine.
